The Dalton International DNA Project (DIDP) now has 327 members

- Of those 327 members 246 have done YDNA tests
- Of the 246 member that have done YDNA tests of those 197 are D*ltons

HOW CAN THESE PROJECTS HELP WITH MY GENEALOGY RESEARCH?

- You can see if you share DNA with any of the other members of the projects and find out how you are related to them.
- This may open new research possibilities for you and allow you to connect with distant cousins.
- Finding siblings of your brick wall ancestors may help to find the parents of your brick wall.

WHO SHOULD I HAVE DO A DNA TEST?

- Autosomal DNA is 50% from your father and 50% from your mother and is passed down in small segments that are completely random.
- Autosomal DNA are the 23andMe, Ancestry, MyHeritage, and Family Finder tests from FamilyTreeDNA.
- Having grandparents, great aunts and uncles do DNA tests can help you get back further.
- Having siblings do DNA tests can also help.

WHAT TO DO WITH MY DNA MATCHES?

- Having multiple siblings of your brick wall ancestor is better than one.
- Looking at your DNA matches trees can help you find your ancestors siblings.
- The Dalton International DNA Project accepts YDNA and Mitochondrial DNA.

WHAT IS YDNA AND MITOCHONDRIAL DNA?

- YDNA is DNA that's generally understood to only be passed from father to son.
- YDNA can detect matches from hundreds of generations ago.
- Surnames are mostly passed down from fathers akin to YDNA.
- Mitochondrial DNA is like YDNA except it is passed from mother to daughter.
- Women typically take their husband's name changing every generation.

HOW CAN YDNA BENEFIT ME?


- YDNA has been used to break multiple people's ancestral brick walls.
- YDNA can sometimes tell you if there was an adoption somewhere in your paternal line.
- YDNA goes further back than autosomal DNA like the Ancestry or 23 and Me tests.
- YDNA can connect you to others who have also done YDNA testing.
- If you can find a distant cousin to do YDNA testing, you can prove your lineage back to a common ancestor.


- You can transfer your DNA test from 23andMe, Ancestry, or MyHeritage to FamilyTreeDNA for free.

HOW DO I JOIN THE PROJECTS?

- First you must download your current DNA test results from 23andMe, Ancestry, MyHeritage, or have taken a test at FamilyTreeDNA.
- Then you transfer your results to FamilyTreeDNA or GEDmatch.
- Then you go to the project page: FamilyTreeDNA.com/groups/Dalton-international and click Join in the top right-hand corner of the page.
- Then go to GEDmatch.com and click Ancestor Projects and scroll down to the Dalton International DNA GEDmatch Project and click join.
